




This year, I was lucky enough to realise my dream of being published, and writing about my travels.

2020 Andrew World Competition Entry - Auxiliary Table

This table is a unique blend of traditional Chinese interlocking joinery techniques, Japanese shou sugi ban, and the Australian native grevillea flower.

Using time honoured craftsmen techniques, it is purely, simply, timber. Only sustainably sourced timber, and even reclaimed timber or offcuts, with no nails or screws, only natural oils, stains. The artful application of fire to 'singe' the outer layers for protection is a visual reminder that even charred wood serves a purpose.

In nature, life continues to find a way. After a bushfire, the Australian native landscape is renewed with diverse growth from the seeds lying dormant under the topsoil. So, under the charred tray table is a clean (or reclaimed) timber table top with the burned imprint of Australian native grevillea flower.

Assembled like a 3D jigsaw puzzle, using techniques that have stood the test of time, it can be disassembled and repaired endlessly. Longevity is the key to sustainability, and a reminder of the wonder of nature and why we must protect it.





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Using shou sugi ban technique applied to varying degrees at strategic places, reclaimed wood and off-cuts, the table is assembled using ancient Chinese interlocking joinery techniques.


A contemporary secret garden, with a vibrant colour palette to complement the natural surrounds, set in a garden nursery.


Be transported to the markets of Provence, France, with the re-imagined l'Occitane store concept, "Escape to Occitania".

Right: storefront concept sketch. Hand sketch with copics.







The custom brick wall behind the POS cart resembles the storefront, to bring the outside in and evoke the memory of shopping at an open air French market, with the scent of lavender all around.





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Above: computer render using Revit with Enscape, finished in Photoshop Left: shop floor plan. Revit. Not shown to scale.



RIEDEL handmade decanters




Above: concept development sketches, Below: physical model Below Rigbht: materials board








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




Above: render using Sketchup and VRay Below: floor plan (AutoCAD)


